

- Cooperative education (or co-operative education) is a structured method of combining classroom-based education with practical work experience.
 - A cooperative education experience, commonly known as a "co-op", provides academic credit for structured job experience.
 - Cooperative education is taking on new importance in helping young people to make the school-to-work transition.
 - Cooperative learning falls under the umbrella of work-integrated learning (alongside internships, service learning and clinical placements)
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- ▶ Collaborative learning is a method of teaching and learning in which students team together to explore a significant question or create a meaningful project.
 - ▶ A group of students discussing a lecture or students from different schools working together over the Internet on a shared assignment are both examples of collaborative learning.

SOME DIFFERENCES BETWEEN COLLABORATIVE AND COOPERATIVE LEARNING

COOPERATIVE LEARNING

- The instructor is the center of authority in the class
- Students work together in small groups
- Face to face interaction
- Positive Interdependence
- Interpersonal Skills
- Teachers become learners at times, and learners sometimes teach



COLLABORATIVE LEARNING

- Knowledge is a social construct
- Promotes student-faculty interaction and familiarity.
- Encourages diversity understanding
- Encourages diversity understanding
- Creates an environment of active, involved, exploratory learning
- Students team together to explore a significant question or create a meaningful project.
